HOW TO GET THE
BEST OUT OF YOUR
MANAGEMENT
LEARNING

Management programs are designed:

- a. To facilitate deep and rich appreciation of the interplay of multiple discipline such as Production systems, Business strategy, Marketing, Finance, Human resources and Data sciences
- b. To stimulate and hone problem solving and critical thinking skills,
- c. To create awareness and perspectives on the importance of relationship and emotional skills, leadership, values and sustainability.
- d. to promote interactive and applied learning thru a mixed pedagogy that includes case study, field projects, internship and simulation.
- e. To be sector agnostic and impart learning thru the functional lens.

HOW CAN STUDENTS AUGMENT THEIR CLASSROOM LEARNING BY CREATING THEIR OWN PARALLEL LEARNING METHOD AND LEARNING TRACKS.

1) Learning Method

Learning needs to be processed by reflection, discussion and application. This is an important pre-condition for assimilation and absorption. The student needs to therefore not only prepare before the class but also create his own learning diary.

It is important to reflect on what was learnt in each class at the end of the day and create a learning diary. The student may also want to look up a textbook or the net for incremental learning or reinforcement.

This practice will also help prepare for exams or competitions or placement.

When you find that you are not able to write a meaningful summary of your learning, it is early warning sign that you are not focusing. And when you are able to write a good summary, it will lift your confidence and make learning a joyous (or less stressful) process.

Your learning diary can be written notes, or it can even be an audio/video summary. You can create a learning diary by theme and integrate all the content you can put together from all your sources.

Capturing the learning in a notebook or Audio book is different from and incremental to the notes that some students make in the class session as it creates that critical opportunity to reflect and review the ideas/concepts discussed and raise questions.

2) Learning track

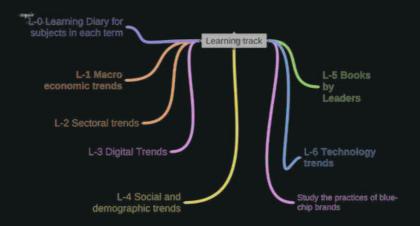
It is important to supplement your academic learning with additional learning tracks. Business world is live and buzzing and business concepts and models are exposed to continuous test, adoption, rejection and creation. When you relate (apply/study) the concepts you learn in the classroom, to what you observe/see in the real world, your understanding could become deep and rich. The faculty will bring in real-world examples to you to explain an idea. But when you start connecting the real world with the concepts yourself, your ability to process, interpret and internalize the concept onus becomes robust.

To illustrate, after you learn how to read a balance sheet in the classroom look up the annual results of companies in different sectors and interpret their financial performance or ratios.

Another example: if a student were to collect the advertising creative (Press/ TV/ Digital advertisement) of a brand (Say Maruti Car) over a period of time and reflect on the target audience, positioning statement, competitive context the classroom learning from a Branding session would get strengthened.

More importantly, the how business responds to Socio-Economic-Political-competitive factors is something you will have to eventually contend with as a practitioner. And as amanagement student you can get a head start if you start creating learning tracks. In the process you will also connect better with what is taught.

Here is an indicative learning track that you may create in term -1 for example and keep adding more tracks as you progress.



3) What are you learning?

Management education has 2 important learning paths integrated in the design. The first one is the functional track and the second sometimes overlooked path is the basic management skill such as critical thinking, problem solving, developing frameworks for evaluation and integration. Behind (or beyond) the functional knowledge that may be imparted, lies the thinking framework.

It is important for the student to be alive to the second path which is arguably the more important learning outcome in a management school.

When you write the daily learning diary you should seize the opportunity to reflect on both the functional learning and thinking skill

4) Articulation

Articulation and Presentation are crucial to deliver the idea/concept and management education design factors this in the learning pedagogy. The aesthetics of the presentation (form) and the language (vocabulary/grammar/sentence structure) are important. However in a business context, prioritization/stacking of the idea with weightage, interlinkage of all the parts and development of sensitivity/scenario analysis are more important. Whether it is a case discussion or a conceptual framework or answering a question in the term examination, the ability to present and highlight the points in their order of importance and assigning weights to each point is under test. It is important to cultivate that style as it could make a big difference in making an impact whenever/wherever you talk.

5) Inductive and deductive logic

An important aspect of learning is the ability to

- Abstract and draw general principles from the sample or example.
- Flex/adapt and apply a general principle to a given context.

This skill can be acquired through conscious awareness and practice.

The concepts/model that are learnt in class will find meaning/value only when know it with such clarity as to when, where and how to apply them.

Without improving this ability, you may know many things but not know what is relevant in a given context and/ or may not have the ability to use life experiences to create a framework yourself.

The case method of learning is intended to improve your ability on this dimension. You should bring more awareness to your own ability to apply inductive and deductive logic

6) Peer Learning

Let's look at 2 aspects of peer learning.

- a. In a class discussion or in your group there is an opportunity to 'listen' to different perspectives and also reflect on the thinking patterns of other students and work on your self-improvement.
- b. Given the demand on your time as you concurrently learn many subjects, the smart thing to do is to leverage your learning groups. But oftentimes, the learning group is used to distribute or delegate work.

That is a dysfunctional approach. A better approach would be to have different members of the group work on different tasks but then meet to discuss and debate and get the full benefit of the group's collective knowledge.

7) Choosing a job/career

- a. A classical way to look at career choice would be triangulate the following:
- i. What interests you (passion)
- ii. What are you good at (competence)
- iii. What are the current trends and what are the emerging opportunities (sectors/job roles)

Look for a job where all three are met at a reasonably high level. And create 2 or 3 back up options as well

b. If you have enough self-awareness, you will know the answer to the first 2 aspects. If you have a systematic way of tracking business, market and sectors, you can form a view on current and future opportunities. And of course you can ask senior alumni or corporate leaders for additional insight about a sector or job role.

To Summarize, adopt the CARE model.

- · Create own digital/audio/text learning track.
- · Absorb and assimilate the learning.
- · Reflect on it.
- Explore

At IBA we will facilitate and enable your learning through program design and pedagogy. But remember learning happens on learner's terms. And you need to evolve a template for yourself and take responsibility for your learning. This conscious adoption of a learning template should form your learning for life.

One of the most significant Hindu festivals is Saraswati Puja, which is celebrated in the eastern part of India. On Vasant Panchami, it is performed in honour of the occasion. The goddess Saraswati represents knowledge, wisdom, the arts, music, and sciences. The event is held in the Hindu month of Magh, which falls in January or February, and is observed by all.

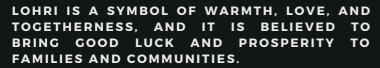

'Living with Dignity: An Action Research (A Case Study of SOS)'

Indus Business Academy Bangalore organized a guest lecture on 'Living with Dignity: An Action Research (Case Study of SOS) on 14th March 2023. The speaker of the event was Dr.Navin Gupta, a behavioral scientist, trainer, and management consultant. He has more than 34 years of academic experience. He started his professional career as a freelance corporate trainer and professional coach by working with several renowned companies and government organizations. He has been serving as the Director, Hindustan Institute of Management and Computer Studies (HIMCS), Sharda Group of Institutions, Mathura, UP, since October 2010. Currently, he is the chair of AIMS-Agra Chapter.



Dr Navin Guptatalked about Agra, that is famous for the Taj Mahal, as well as LAPKAs, who are auto drivers, taxi drivers, and tourist guides. He shared the way Lapkas are being treated, and because of the ill-treatment by bureaucrats, politicians, etc., they have low self-esteem. Also, lapkas don't receive any sort of recognition for their services and face an identity crisis. It leads them to get involved in petty crimes like chain snatching, stealing passenger goods, etc. Sir mentioned it as his source of motivation to initiate a "training program" with them to teach them the art of living with dignity. Besides all these, he initiated a project titled 'Soldiers of Society' (SOS).

Moving forward, the speaker discussed the significance of "Motivation Theory", the source of motivation that is derived from being rich morally, economically, and socially, as well as by also measuring one's individual contribution. In order to explain the concept, he cited the example of an auto driver nazi and his act of loyalty and honesty that has become a behavioral benchmark. He then proceeded with his plan of action (POA) for research using scientific tools. He narrated how he and his team used to religiously organize the training program "LTA," which stands for "Lapka to Aapka," at 4 p.m. every Friday, emphasizing the importance of time management. On a similar note, the speaker also discussed "AtithiDevo Bhava", a government of India initiative to promote Indian tourism. He then mentioned one of the models, namely "knowledge, attitude, and practice" (KAP), that he makes use of.

Furthermore, he went into explaining the genesis of the project, where the focus was on building relationships between the Lapps and the common people by setting rules and regulations. He then talked about the tools used for the training program, i.e., Appreciative Inquiry (AI) as an OD Intervention, Juggler (Madari) Technology, and Un-Conferencing. The speaker also discussed the relevance of the different scientific technologies used, of which A.I. technology was the most popular among all those involving positive psychology, the Pygmalion Effect, creative visualization, and enhancing self-esteem through appreciation and recognition in the media. Further, Sir shared some of his valuable training experiences, including his training plan for LTA and training contents (ideal behavior, Kaizen application, HAS analysis, traffic rules, etc.). He also underscored the habit of practicing ECG, i.e., empathy, compassion, and gratitude.



Subsequently, Speaker Dr.Navin Gupta Sir moved forward by sharing his commitments towards the LTA Training Program, i.e., education, medical, and legal counseling. He shared one of the initiatives taken by rolling out VIKALP (a product of Samagra) to be used as a non-tobacco Gutka substitute for the LAPKAs. He then proceeded with the other impactful initiatives like SOS Bhojnalaya, inaugurated on October 2nd, 2016; auto dustbins; and the feedback mechanism from the passengers by recycling wedding cards. Sir applauded the major contribution of SOS volunteers in social services despite the challenges like rumours, sabotage because of political interest, etc. He mentioned the euphoria behind the change in program title from LTA to SOS. Eventually, the speaker shared some of his current projects, including SOS Jail Bandhu at the Agra Central Jail, inaugurated on the 11th of February to observe World Day of the Sick. This training involves psychological counseling, SOS cookies, CCTV training, and talent hunting. This brought the meaningful session to an end.
